<p>Our working environment is extremely demanding over a short time period. Applicants should be aware that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This is a farming environment and days off may be extremely limited during our picking season • Work hours are not calendar based, but are dependent on crop maturity and weather • Expect 50 - 80 hours per week, rotated shifts available to ensure sufficient rest • Expect shifts to run between 8am and 11pm depending on picking locations (10-14 hour shifts common) • As agricultural employment, overtime provisions do not apply for these positions <p>Applicants must be available from June until September</p>
